Referring back to August 2013 when I started B. E (Mining Engineering) at Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology (MPUAT) — Rajasthan state of India, through Afghanistan's government scholarship, my English proficiency was relatively poor that I was not able to comprehend fully lectures in the classrooms, thus a headache were university textbooks, I felt fully blinded and did not know what to do. I not only felt ashamed of being an international student and not knowing the international language, but also felt down and miserable. Meeting several difficulties, I was totally frustrated, and sometimes I wanted to quit and return home. To be honest, I got a total of three backlogs on my first academic year and a very low CGPA despite struggling a lot and memorizing text and phrases from the books without knowing the concept, which affected later on my OGPA as well. There was another reason for obtaining low marks, that the Education System in Afghanistan is of lower quality compared to Education System in India, it seemed like I was trapped. This situation made me think of taking extra classes including English classes outside the University campus which were quite helpful. These classes helped me a lot, my language proficiency improved, I made precious friends and everyone wanted to communicate with me. In short, it ignited the hope which was about to die in my mind. Today, as I look back on those days, taking those extra classes, was amongst the best decisions of my academic session in India, contributing to adopting to the new education system and gaining my degree. Time changes and so the situations, after spending months of learning English, my teacher requested me to assist him in his English classes. So I converted from being a student to assist my teacher. It seems like more opportunities were beyond the University campus, I participated in many other activities like cycling, photography, debate, and creative writing contests within the city and won many prizes. Besides, I felt more comfortable learning my academic lessons, reading international journals, papers, and books related to Mining and Geology. As saying goes that everyone lives with his/her choices. And those choices that I made benefited my later life. Nonetheless, those choices provided an extra income in my career journey, both in a government job and private life, now I have a coaching class of my own in Kabul city which is pretty famous. As a result, I am very thankful for having gone through all those difficult days in the past. In conclusion, obstacles are not meant to give up on our dreams and goals or missions but to convert them into opportunities and wear them like armor. If the challenges inside the University campus did not lead me to take those extra classes, I would return to Afghanistan not earning a degree, thus could not secure today's opportunities such as an official job in the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum and mastering the English language.
