SCHOOL CERTIFICATE (SC)

To qualify for the SC, candidates must enter and sit for a range of syllabuses as stated in the regulations and must obtain a maximum aggregate score of 45 and achieve one of the following combinations of result.

One credit and five passes including English Language.

Two credits and three passes including English Language.

Attainment in a syllabus is indicated by a numerical SC grade, of which grade ONE is the highest and grade EIGHT the lowest.

For each syllabus the corresponding General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level (GCE O Level) grade A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d) or E(e) is given, grade A*(a*) being the highest and grade E(e) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade E(e) are not reported on certificates.

English Language contains an oral test. Where the candidate has passed the oral test this is reported on the certificate by grades 1(ONE) high to 5(FIVE) low. Certain other language syllabuses contain oral tests. Where the candidate has passed the oral test this is reported on the certificate.
