



Cooperation Agreement

between

Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur

and

Ghent University

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote international academic, cultural and scientific exchange, Ghent University (Belgium) and Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur (India) enter into this Cooperation Agreement.

The Rectors of both institutions, for the purpose of furthering cooperation through both educational and academic exchanges within chemistry, materials science and physics, hereby affirm their intent to promote such exchanges as will be of mutual benefit for their respective institutions. Educational and academic exchanges are considered here to include but not be limited to:

- Development of mutually beneficial academic programmes and courses
- Exchange of academic staff and research assistants for the main purpose of teaching
- Reciprocal assistance for visiting academic staff and students
- Exchange of students for study and research
- Exchange of documentation, pedagogical information and research materials

Both parties decide by mutual consent that all the financial agreements will have to be negotiated and will depend on the availability of funds.

A. Student exchange

Both parties hereby agree that:

1. The exchange of students and staff shall be administered through the International Relations Office UGent and Indian Institute of Technology – Kharagpur through the T&P office.
2. Each university may in principle nominate not more than two undergraduate or graduate students for exchange each year.
3. However, this number may vary in any given year provided a balance of exchanges is attained over the term of the agreement.
4. While nominees will normally be accepted for exchange by the host university, the host university reserves the right to review the applications of nominees and make final decisions concerning admission.
5. A selected student may study for a period of 3 to 12 months at the host university depending on mutual approval and depending on the level of training.
6. The travelling expenses of students could be supported by the delegating university; lodging and living expenses could be supported by the host university.
7. Exchange students will not pay examination, matriculation and tuition fees to the host institution, but shall pay these to the home institution as per the usual regulations of the home institution.
8. Any academic credit received during the course of the program at the host institution may be transferred to the home institution in accordance with the appropriate regulations of the home institution.
9. Each host institution will issue appropriate documents for each accepted nominee for the issuance of a student visa, in accordance with current national laws. It is the responsibility of each individual student to obtain a student visa in their home country in a timely manner.
10. The student will provide his or her own health, accident, repatriation and civil liability insurance.

11. Both institutes express the desire to explore possibilities for Joint Ph.D.'s. Each of these will be subject to approval by the competent offices in both institutes.

B. Staff exchange

Both parties hereby agree that:

1. Both parties agree to support the exchange during each academic year of maximum 2 professors or members of scientific staff from each university.
2. However, this number may vary in any given year provided a balance of exchanges is attained over the term of the agreement.
3. The travel expenses of staff members of the partner universities could be supported by the home university. The expenses for accommodation and subsistence could be supported by the host university for a maximum pool of time equivalent to 3 months per academic year.
4. Each host institution will issue appropriate documents for each visiting staff member for the issuance of a visa, in accordance with current national laws. It is the responsibility of each individual staff member to obtain a visa in their home country in a timely manner.

C. Scientific research

1. Collaboration in research will be on topics related to common interests.
2. Details of each research program or research project shall be arranged by mutual consent by the relevant departments, centres, etc., of both parties subject to the approval of the higher authorities of each party.
3. Relevant academic materials, technical information including research reports, periodicals, etc. and other information available to each party shall be exchanged between parties.
4. All information and/or data that may be exchanged, acquired and shared in connection with the areas of cooperation between both parties pursuant to this Cooperation Agreement shall be treated strictly confidential and shall not under any circumstances be divulged by the receiving party unless and otherwise such information has already been in public domain.
5. Any cost and expenses that may be incurred by jointly performing research programs and research activities shall be negotiated and agreed upon to the satisfaction of both parties before starting such programs and activities.
6. Each institution will adhere to the intellectual laws of their respective institutes and countries. Intellectual property developed during the visit of an exchange student will be governed by the rules of the host institute unless otherwise specified by an alternate agreement. The two institutions shall jointly own results of clearly defined collaborative projects. Whenever one institution receives any information from the partner under a clearly defined non-disclosure agreement, necessary steps will be taken to protect the intellectual property received.

For Ghent University, Prof Patrick Bultinck will be the responsible academic staff member of the Cooperation Agreement. For Indian Institute of Technology - Kharagpur, this will be Prof P.K. Chattaraj.

This Cooperation Agreement as well as succeeding plans concerning the concrete proposals of cooperation, shall be effective after approval of the terms of the agreement by the appropriate authorities of the universities. It will remain in effect for a period of 5 years. Thereafter, it will be reviewed and can be amended or renewed as agreed by both parties.





Dear colleague,

Thank you for mail. I will reply more exactly as soon as when time permits. We remain very positive with respect to the applications and so you may assume that all will be fine. There is one thing you could help us with and that are the financial arrangements. We understand that you know that we aim to break even. This is much easier for us if a cooperation agreement could be established between our institutes (such as the one I left in Kharagpur in September). If we have such an agreement we get from our rectorate very significant discounts for accommodation and a stipend for the students. All in all we are talking some 2000 euro and you will understand that we would like to benefit from that. However, I believe no decision has yet been taken about this agreement.

Anyway, we are willing to accept the students but if you can offer any help in helping get us funding from our university, we would appreciate it.
